

Dear Sirs and Madam,

I am writing to you because I have been informed that you constitute a group holding itself out as the Standing Committee of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth. It has come to my attention that recently you have taken actions in support of an attempt to take the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth out of the Episcopal Church and into affiliation with the Province of the Southern Cone. I understand that these have included meeting as the purported Standing Committee of an entity that identifies itself as a diocese in union with the Province of the Southern Cone, and electing officers of such a purported Committee. These actions directly conflict with the Constitution and canons of the Episcopal Church.

Canon I.17.8 of the Episcopal Church provides that "[a]ny person accepting any office in this Church shall well and faithfully perform the duties of that office in accordance with the Constitution and Canons of this Church and of the Diocese in which the office is being exercised." Your recent actions demonstrate that you have been and are unable to well and faithfully fulfill your duties as members of the Standing Committee of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth under Canon I.17.8. Accordingly, with this letter I inform you that I do not recognize you as the Standing Committee of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth.

I regret the decisions that you have made to attempt to take the Diocese out of
The Episcopal Church and the necessary consequences of these actions. I give thanks for
your service in the past, and pray that it may once again be a blessing to this Diocese. I





Resolution Number: 1982-A010
Title: Amend Constitution Article V.1 [Admission of New
 Dioceses--Second Reading]
Legislative Action Taken: Concurred As Submitted
Final Text:

Resolved, the House of Bishops concurring, **That the following proposed amendments having been made known to the several Dioceses and Missionary Dioceses and the Convocation of the American Churches in Europe in accordance with Article XI of the Constitution, Section 1 of Article V of the Constitution, the 67th General Convention adopt the following amendments to Article V of the Constitution, to wit:**

Add the word "existing" before the word "Dioceses" where such word first appears in the second sentence of Section 1 of Article V, and strike the last sentence of said Section and substitute a new sentence therefor, so that said Section 1 as amended will read:

ARTICLE V.

Sec. 1 A new Diocese may be formed, with the consent of the General Convention and under such conditions as the General Convention shall prescribe by General Canon or Canons, (1) by the division of an existing Diocese; (2) by the junction of two or more existing Dioceses or of parts of two or more Dioceses; or (3) by the erection into a Diocese of an unorganized area evangelized as provided in Article VI. The proceedings shall originate in a Convocation of the Clergy and Laity of the unorganized area called by the Bishop for that purpose; or, with the approval of the Bishop, in the Convention of the Diocese to be divided; or (when it is proposed to form a new Diocese by the junction of two or more *existing* Dioceses or of parts of two or more Dioceses), by mutual agreement of the Conventions of the Dioceses concerned, with the approval of the Bishop of each Diocese. In case the Episcopate of a Diocese be vacant, no proceedings toward its division shall be taken until the vacancy is filled. ~~When it shall appear to the satisfaction of the General Convention, by a certified copy of the proceedings and other documents and papers laid before it, that all the conditions for the formation of the new Diocese have been compiled with and that it has acceded to the Constitution and Canons of this Church, such new Diocese shall thereupon be admitted to union with the General Convention.~~

After consent of the General Convention, when a certified copy of the duly adopted Constitution of the New Diocese, including an unqualified accession to the Constitution and Canons of this Church, shall have been filed with the Secretary of the General Convention and approved by the Executive Council of this Church, such new Diocese shall thereupon be in union with the General Convention.

Resolution Number: 1982-B018
Title: Ratify the Division of the Diocese of Dallas Into Two Jurisdictions
Legislative Action Taken: Concurred As Submitted
Final Text:

Resolved, the House of Deputies concurring, **That this 67th General Convention ratifies the division of the Diocese of Dallas to create a new Diocese which, until the new Diocese adopts a name, shall be referred to as the Western Diocese with the continuing Diocese to be known as the Diocese of Dallas. The boundaries of the two Dioceses shall be as follows:**

- a) The Diocese of Dallas shall include 25 counties: Grayson, Denton, Collin, Dallas (excluding the portion of the city of Grand Prairie that is in Dallas county), Rockwall, Ellis, Navarro, Henderson, Kaufman, Van Zandt, Hunt, Fannin, Lamar, Delta, Hopkins, Rains, Wood, Upshur, Camp, Franklin, Titus, Red River, Morris, Bowie, Cass.**
- b) The Western Diocese shall include 23 counties: Wichita, Archer, Young, Stephens, Eastland, Brown, Mills, Hamilton, Comanche, Erath, Somervell, Palo Pinto, Jack, Clay, Montague, Wise, Parker, Hood, Bosque, Hill, Johnson, Tarrant, Cooke, and the portion of the City of Grand Prairie located in Dallas County; and be it further**

Resolved, **That this 67th General Convention receive the following evidence supporting this resolution:**

- 1. Certified copy of the resolution, duly approved by the Diocese of Dallas, committing the Diocese to its division and to the formation of a new Diocese;**
- 2. The consent of the Bishop of Dallas;**
- 3. Certificate of the Secretary of the Convention of the Diocese of Dallas concerning the number of Parishes, Missions, Institutions and Presbyters in the continuing Diocese and in the new Diocese;**
- 4. Map of the existing and proposed continuing and new Diocese;**
- 5. Certificate of the Treasurer of the Diocese of Dallas concerning the financial abilities of the continuing Diocese and of the new Diocese, together with supporting financial data;**
- 6. Certificate of the Chancellor of the Diocese of Dallas that all aforesaid documents have been duly executed, are accurate, and are entitled to full faith and credit, and further that all of the appropriate and pertinent provisions of the Constitution and Canons of the General Convention of the Episcopal Church in the USA and the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese of Dallas have been fully complied with in respect of this submission.**



1. I am Marion Roy McClain, also known as Sam McClain. I was awarded a Masters of Theological Studies degree from Seabury-Western Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois. Later, I was awarded a Doctor of Ministry degree from the Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary in Austin, Texas. I was ordained as a priest in The Episcopal Church in 1977. I served as curate at Holy Nativity Episcopal Church in Plano, Texas from June 1977 to December 1978. Since January 1979, I have served continuously as the rector of St. Luke’s Episcopal Church, a parish then in the Episcopal Diocese of Dallas and since 1983 in the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth. I have attended every annual and special meeting of the Diocesan Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth, including the Primary Convention of the Diocese on November 13, 1982. I also attended every annual and special meeting of the

Diocesan Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of Dallas that was held between 1979 and 1982, including the special and annual meetings of 1982, when my parish was a part of that Diocese. In my work as clergy canonically resident in the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth, I have served on the Commission on Ministry, the Executive Council, the Ecclesiastical Court, and as Dean of the Southern Deanery of the Diocese. All statements made herein are based upon my personal knowledge in the ordinary course of my duties as an ordained priest and rector of a parish in The Episcopal Church and its Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth.

2. Since before 1982, The Episcopal Church has been providing religious services in the north-central Texas area. Since 1983, The Episcopal Church has been providing these religious services in the north-central Texas area through its Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth, which has continuously used (1) the name “Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth” and (2) a graphical depiction of a distinctive seal (the “Diocesan Seal”). Reproduced below is a true and correct copy of the Diocesan Seal:



3. This distinctive seal was created and established as the official seal of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth in 1983. Attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** is a true and correct copy of an excerpt from a 1983 Diocesan newsletter entitled “Diocesan Seal Rich in Heritage,” which includes a depiction of the Diocesan Seal and describes its symbolic meaning.





DIOCESAN SEAL RICH IN HERITAGE

by The Rt. Rev. A. Donald Davies
1 Bishop of Fort Worth

The official seal of the Diocese of Fort Worth is now complete. In keeping with the highly developed discipline of heraldry, the seal was designed by Mr. Eugene Maxey, The Rev. Messrs. Harrison Beste, William Crary and William Risinger. Mr. Maxey, a member of St. Andrew's, is an expert in the science of heraldry and holds membership in heraldry societies in America, England, Scotland and Canada.

Each diocese of the Anglican Communion has an official seal which reflects something of the nature of the life of the diocese. In this new seal our heritage and our commitment to our Lord's mission are artistically set forth. A brief explanation:

Fort Worth, the See City, is indicated by the fortress battlements which divide the Shield through the center horizontally.

The Longhorn Steer, a symbol of a major industry within the diocese, is also a reminder of the frontier spirit and the venturesome nature of the people of God in this part of the country.

The Star, has a two-fold meaning. In Christendom the five pointed star symbolizes the Incarnation. It also stands for the Lone Star State of Texas.

The Griffin, symbol of guardianship of the faithful, is in the upper left corner. The Griffin, half lion and half eagle, is an ancient symbol used by the Celtic people of Great Britain. Bishop Alexander Charles Garrett, an Irishman, utilized the Griffin in the Seal of the Diocese of Dallas to indicate our heritage with the Church of England.


We chose the Griffin because of our Welsh heritage and our linkage with the Diocese of Dallas. Of great significance is the fact that the Apostolic succession of the American Episcopate flowed through David, Patron Saint and Bishop of Wales.

The Keys of St. Peter, depict the authority of the Apostolic ministry bestowed upon the Church by our Lord.

The Bishop's Staff, in black and silver, resembles the crozier used by the Bishop.

Both the presiding Bishop and I were once rectors of Grace Church, Monroe, Louisiana. We had identical croziers which were presented to us as thank-offerings by the people of Grace Church.


The banner carries a motto: Los Brazos De Dios or "The Arms of God." Written in Spanish to reflect the Hispanic culture in Texas, the motto is a reminder of our Servanthood. While Christians are upheld and supported by "the arms of God," Christians are cognizant that by His Grace we are to be "the arms of God" in the Lord's work and mission in today's world.

BEFORE ME THE UNDERSIGNED AUTHORITY, on this day personally appeared EDWIN F. GULICK, JR., who, being by me personally sworn, upon his oath stated:

1. My name is Edwin F. Gulick, Jr. I am over eighteen (18) years of age, of sound mind, and fully capable and competent to make this Affidavit. I have personal knowledge of the facts stated herein, and all facts stated herein are true and correct.

2. I was the Bishop of The Episcopal Church’s Diocese of Kentucky, with my offices in Louisville, Kentucky, from 1994, when I was ordained a bishop in The Episcopal Church, until 2010, when I retired. From February 7, 2009 to November 14, 2009, I also served as the Provisional Bishop of The Episcopal Church’s Diocese of Fort Worth, exercising “all the duties and offices” of the Bishop of the Diocese as authorized under Episcopal Church Canon III.13. I currently reside in Virginia and am serving part time as Assistant Bishop of the Church’s Episcopal Diocese of Virginia.

3. In my capacity as Provisional Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth, and acting through the Chancellor of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth, Kathleen Wells, I authorized John A. Powell and his law firm Naman, Howell, Smith & Lee, LLP (“Naman

Howell”) to file applications for registration of the name “Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth” and the official seal of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth as service marks with the United States Patent and Trade Office. In addition, in a meeting on April 25, 2009, the Board of Trustees of the Corporation of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth authorized registration of the name and seal of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth.

4. At no time during my service as Provisional Bishop did I or the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth authorize Jack Leo Iker, or any faction or entity he purports to lead or represent, to use the name or official seal of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth.



1. My name is Kathleen Wells. I am over eighteen years of age, of sound mind, and fully capable and competent to make this Affidavit. I have personal knowledge of the facts stated herein, and all facts stated herein are true and correct.

2. Since February 7, 2009, I have served as the Chancellor of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth (the "Diocese"), which is a subordinate unit of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America ("The Episcopal Church").

3. Attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** is a true and correct copy of a letter dated January 22, 2009 and attachment sent to the Steering Committee North Texas Episcopalians (the "Steering Committee"), of which I was a member of the board of directors at the time, by Geoffrey Mantooth, who is counsel of record for Defendant Iker in this case. Mantooth erroneously purported in the letter also to represent the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth and the

Corporation of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth at that time. The Steering Committee acted as representative of the Episcopalians in the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth in preparation for the special convention held on February 7, 2009 to reorganize the diocesan leadership after Iker and other former leaders of the Diocese had left The Episcopal Church and the diocese on or about November 15, 2008. The letter of the Defendant's attorney to the Steering Committee admits that dual use of the diocesan name and seal by the Episcopalian faction and faction of the former Episcopalians who had left the Church on or about November 15, 2008 is likely to cause confusion.






Dear Mr. Cabe:

We represent the Corporation of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth and The Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth (referred to herein as "Diocese") in intellectual property matters.

These are uneasy times, both spiritually and economically. As parishes and individual members work through the transition of the Diocese associating itself with the Anglican community in a manner that is independent of the association known as The Episcopal Church, there are likely to be disagreements. It is our hope that these can be worked out. Episcopalians do many good things for this community and the need for spiritual guidance and harmony is higher than ever in these uneasy times.

As you are no doubt aware, the Diocese was founded in the early 1980's. For many years, the Diocese has used "The Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth" as a trademark for religious services and publications. The Diocese has also used its seal mark for religious services and publications:



Consequently, the Diocese has common law rights to its marks (service marks and trademarks).


It has come to our attention that the Steering Committee North Texas Episcopalians (referred to herein as "Steering Committee") is using both marks. For example, attached is a copy of a website "episcopaldiocesefortworth.org" which is headlined "The Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth", with the seal mark to the right. Furthermore, the headline states that the Steering Committee represents the Diocese. Furtherstill, the domain name "episcopaldiocesefortworth.org" captures the name mark and elements of the seal mark. In addition, the Steering Committee is using the marks in advertisements and elsewhere.

Such actions by the Steering Committee lead to a likelihood of confusion and constitute trademark infringement. Such actions also constitute a misrepresentation, as the Steering Committee does not represent the Diocese.

You may be unaware of the issues of trademark infringement and misrepresentation. We therefore ask that you stop all use of the marks, whether on web sites, in advertisements, domain names or other ways, and stop claiming to represent the Diocese.

I look forward to your response within fourteen (14) days from the date of this letter.
