RULE 11 AGREEMENT TO PRESERVE DOCUMENTS

In consideration of the mutual promises and obligations set forth herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the "Local Episcopal Parties," the "Local Episcopal Congregations," and the Defendants (collectively, the "Parties") enter into the following Rule 11 Agreement (the "Agreement") as follows:

- 1. This Agreement is immediately effective when signed by all of the Parties and will remain effective until modified by further written agreement or until all claims in the above-captioned matter are finally and completely resolved, with no further right to appeal.
- 2. Defendants will preserve and safeguard all documents in their possession relating to bank accounts, endowments, trusts, investment accounts, investments, real, personal, or intellectual property, expenditures, income, finances, transactions, taxes, and any and all other

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documents requested in "Plaintiff The Rt. Rev. C. Wallis Ohl's First Request for Production," served November 9, 2010, or in "Local Episcopal Parties First Requests for Production of Documents," served February 8, 2011. This includes all documents currently existing and all documents created after the effective date of this agreement as well as any and all electronicallystored documents, emails (with attachments), and hidden system files and metadata presently located on or contained in a free standing computer or laptop, or on any part of a server, CPU or digital device that may contain data storage capabilities. To the extent any such documents are subject to a destruction schedule or would otherwise be destroyed or disposed of in the ordinary course of business, Defendants will suspend such destruction schedule or business practices and instead retain and preserve the documents.

- 3. The Local Episcopal Parties and the Local Episcopal Congregations will also preserve and safeguard any and all documents in their possession or control that correspond to the documents described in paragraph 2.
- 4. Defendants, the Local Episcopal Parties, and the Local Episcopal Congregations further represent that, since this lawsuit was filed on April 14, 2009, they have not destroyed or otherwise disposed of any of the documents described in paragraph 2.
- 5. A signed copy of this Rule 11 Agreement will be filed of record in this case. Facsimile or scanned signatures are considered as original signatures and given the same effect. The Parties do not make any admission or waive any right by entering into this agreement except as provided herein. Any disputes about a party's compliance with this Rule 11 agreement may be presented to the Court for determination. The Parties' attorneys' signatures on this document are conclusive evidence of the Parties' intent that this document constitute a Rule 11 Agreement enforceable upon filing with the Court. Tex. R. CIV. P. 11.
